15. Multidisciplinary / interdisciplinary

Keeping in view the NEP 2020, the Jorhat College (Amalgamated) envisions transforming itself into a multidisciplinary institution in near future. As an affiliated college, the Jorhat College (Amalgamated) provides the facility of multiple entry and exit in the undergraduate level from colleges within Dibrugarh University following the same curriculum. As a good practice, the College has undertaken a very ambitious and visionary mega interdisciplinary research endeavour which aims at mobilizing thousand plus students, teachers, alumni along with those of its associate and mentee schools.

The college has embarked upon a gamut of very ambitious interdisciplinary research projects. Those are as follows:

1. The History department along with Department of Economics would compile a history of as many as 300 villages of Jorhat district pertaining to its historical, economic, religious and educational aspects.
2. The Sociology Department and Department of History to start with has embarked upon a sociological research work in which the religious beliefs of Tai Ahoms along with its changes in the last seven centuries or so, would be dealt with.
3. The Department of Education and Department of History going to collect data related to literacy rate of rural people of Jorhat District and the historical background of different schools located the sample villages. Again, the data related to the results of last 10 years of the schools will also to be collected. The data will be collected with the help of interview schedule and questionnaire.
4. Department of Philosophy along with Department of Sociology are to undertake a interdisciplinary project on Scientific temper among the villagers of 100 villages of Jorhat District.

5. Department of Economics and Department of Sociology have planned to work on an interdisciplinary project entitled "The Changing Dynamics of Economic Paradigm of Jorhat Town in 75 Years".

6. Department of Assamese along with Department of English have taken up an interdisciplinary project entitled ' Culture , literature and Society'

7. Department of English along with Department of Assamese have taken up an interdisciplinary project on understanding the behavior of class 10 students of 22 schools in Jorhat on regarding their approach and learning skills towards English.

8. Department of Political Science and Department of Sociology have taken up the project to understand the voting behavior of the voters of Jorhat town.

16. Academic bank of credits (ABC):

As decided in by IQAC and the Academic council to register in the Academic Bank of Credits, the College has initiated the process of registration in DigiLocker. The college is facing a technical glitch. The name of the institution is not available in the drop list. An email citing the problem and requesting NAD to solve the issue has been sent in nad.support@digitalindia.gov.in. the College would complete the registration process as soon as we get the reply.

As a good practice, the college asked all the departments to announce the importance of ABC and make all the faculty members, office staff and most importantly the students aware of ABC and its usefulness.

17. Skill development:

In response to our application seeking permission for Add - on - courses, Dibrugarh University in a letter Ref. No. DU/DR -A/6-1/22/631 dated 08/06/2022 has approved 27 Add - on - courses w.e.f. the Academic session 2022-23. The Add on - courses approved by Dibrugarh University include Cutting and Tailoring, Bridal make -up, Yoga and meditation, Performing Arts, Photography, Para - medical, Electrician, Plumber, PGDCA, Mobile Repairing, T.V.

repairing, D.T.P., Martial Arts, Beautician, Fabric Painting, Waste material management, Glass painting, Craft Baker, Interior Design, Tribal Studies, Adivasi Studies, Spoken English, Translation studies, Creative writing, Pre school Teachers' Training, tourism ,fine arts .

The college with regards to Value-based education continues to provide special course on Gender studies along with Yoga and Meditation

Being an affiliated college of Dibrugarh University, there is limited scope for integrating the vocational courses into mainstream education. The college has prepared a list of Master Crafts persons to provide vocational skills.

A training on vermi-compost has become a regular practice.

As a good practice the college organizes interactive session with various renowned personalities who have marked their contribution in their respective fields in state, national and international platforms deploying their creative skills.

Milin Dutta, a transman from USA, along with Rituparna, a LGBTIQ - Queer activist, accepted the request and delivered a lecture and interacted with the students so as to make the college family aware of the issues related to Gender and Sex.

18.Appropriate integration of Indian Knowledge system (teaching in Indian Language, culture, using online course)

As an affiliated college there is a very limited scope for the college to develop a curriculum. The college has not yet developed a curriculum involving Indian Knowledge system.

The college has persistently worked for the restoration of glorious history and heritage of North-East India. This would make a significant contribution towards Indian (Historical) knowledge system.

Jorhat College has continued its endeavour to preserve and promote the tribal and endangered languages. Sadri and Mising Languages are being promoted. The college has some old manuscripts preserved in the library.

Efforts are on to undertake teaching and learning of more languages like Tai led by the principal, the college has focused upon the glorious history of Tai (Assamese) lexicography, thereby bringing to light and publishing several Tai (Assamese) lexicons and books about Tai lexicography..

The Philosophy department of Jorhat College has organized a series of webinars to promote Indian ancient traditional knowledge.

On 12th July,2021, department of Philosophy of Jorhat College(Amal.), in collaboration with IQAC, organized a national level webinar on " Increasing doctor-patient conflict and the role of state, system and society in it".

On 27th July, 2021, Philosophy department of Jorhat College,in collaboration with its IQAC, organized virtually, the second and third segments of the ICPR sponsored series of lectures and demonstration programme on the occasion of International Day of Yoga-21.

On 22nd August, department of Philosophy of Jorhat College[Amalgamated] organized the last segment of ICPR sponsored series of lectures on the occasion of International Day of Yoga-21. The invited resource person Subhasish Sharma, associate professor, HoD, department of Political science, JB College[Autonomous] delivered an illuminating lecture on `` Yoga and Mental health during Covid pandemic".

On 21st June,2022 on the occasion of International Day of Yoga, the department of Philosophy of Jorhat College, in collaboration with IQAC of the College organised a day-long lecture programme and a Yoga demonstration programme. Arotee Neog, former HoD, department of Philosophy , JB college delivered an illuminating lecture on "Yoga Philosophy: Its Relevance in Present Era".In the Yoga demonstration programme, Ajay Deori, yoga Instructor of Assam Police demonstrated some useful 'Asanas' and 'Pranayamas'

The Jorhat College aims at strengthening the Indian knowledge system in another way. Now that the central government has laid stress on developing all mothertoung of the country and imparting education through mother tongue the Jorhat College has decided to develop glossary of each subject it imparts education in.

The principal has lent out his hands in the compilation of the

ambitious glossary of Technological & Engineering Terms sponsored by the central government.

Besides another very ambitious Peoples' Linguistic Survey of Assam project is in the pipeline, which is expected to rope in several learned alumni and other renowned resource persons.

19.Focus on Outcome based education (OBE):Focus on Outcome based education (OBE):

The College being an affiliated college of Dibrugarh University faces certain limitations to frame an independent policy to transform its curriculum towards Outcome Based Education. The Committee set up by IQAC is working to prepare the draft of a policy to ensure OBE.

The College has been granted permission and the college has presently 27 skill development courses which are recognized by Dibrugarh University. The teachers and experts of these courses have been enlightened the importance of OBE and have been directed by IQAC to imbibe the practices that focuses on OBE.

20.Distance education/online education:

Currently, Jorhat College (Amalgamated) provides distance learning to undergraduate and post graduate courses. The college provides B.A. and M.A. programmes in distance mode which are affiliated to Dibrugarh University (DODL). Besides, Jorhat College (Amalgamated) also has a study centre of KKHSOU (Krishna Kanta Handiqui State Open University) and provides both graduate and post-graduate courses in the distance mode.

As the results of the distance mode is spectacularly good in the last M.A. examination, it has been able to draw students from adjoining and distant areas. In several departments we are aiming not only at 100 percent pass rate, but also at 100 percent first class in distant M.A.

Jorhat College (Amalgamated) is a single stream college and is committed to the pursuit of excellence and overall development of the students. Being an affiliated college to Dibrugarh University, it has been trying to complement the curriculum adopting a holistic approach towards the effective delivery of the curriculum through a structured and transparent process. All the departments follow the curriculum designed and prescribed by the Dibrugarh University.

As per the norms and instruction of the D.U. the college prepared the Academic Calendar for the session .A committee comprising of the Vice Principal, Academic Vice Principal and one/two senior teachers, prepares the time-table for the session. The allotment of classes to the teachers has been done at the departmental level. . All the teachers maintain records of class activities as per the curriculum in the 'Teachers' Academic Diary'. ITC classes, students' seminars, assignments, fieldworks, etc. are conducted to enrich the learning process.To fortify the process of implementation, regular monitoring of the class room proceedings and course progression has been done both at the departmental level by the H.O.D.s and centrally by the Academic Council comprising the HODs, Principal, Vice principal, Academic Vice Principal and the Co-Ordinator of IQAC.

To make them sensitive to the needs and aspirations of the underprivileged sections, the students are engaged in some voluntary services in tea-garden areas, in the nearby Schools for the visually challenged students and also for the hearing-impaired students.

2.2 - Catering to Student Diversity

2.2.1 - The institution assesses the learning levels of the students and organizes special Programmes for advanced learners and slow learners

Jorhat College has adopted a student centric teaching learning methodology to assesses the learning levels of the students. The college tries its best to develop competences like critical thinking and problem solving. Both advanced and slow learners are identified methodically after the admission process. The college admits diverse students with varying abilities and their learning levels are determined through various methods of testing such as sessional tests, class/unit tests, students' seminar, group discussion, sudden test etc. Participative learning is encouraged to enhance learning experiences through activities like internal assessment task, group discussion, seminar paper presentation, field works, guest lectures and workshops. Students have to present seminars, preferably in PPT format and submit hard copies of their paper. Remedial classes and free tutorials are offered for slow learners and additional programmes are offered for advanced learners. Slow learners are counselled by their teachers/mentors. They are given shorter assignments with more variation, repeating work in various forms, giving more hands - on work. Also for them previous year's question papers are discussed as well as methods for solving them are provided. College adopts bi-lingual approach for effective learning. Thus the institution provides all possible avenues of growth for all its learners.

2.3.1 - Student centric methods, such as experiential learning, participative learning and problem solving methodologies are used for enhancing learning experiences

The college prioritizes learning through experience and has created student centred learning programmes such as experiential learning, participative learning and problem solving methodologies for enhancing learning experiences. Each and every department organize talks and guest lectures that provide learning beyond the curriculum. Experiential and participative learning are encouraged through project work, field study, tours, assignments, seminar presentation, group discussions, meritorious students guiding the juniors etc. Critical thinking is encouraged through participation in the strong undergraduate research culture, through debates, class discussions and projects while creativity is fostered through the college magazine and extracurricular activities. Entrepreneurial opportunities and skill development activities take place to round-out skills learned in the class. Practical training is imparted through workshops and training sessions. The mentoring method has been successful in enhancing students' overall performance. The NCC and NSS wings of the college not only provide the students with extra skills to empower themselves. Going beyond the syllabus, under the guidance of NCC/NSS the students are made to feel/understand about moral responsibility, human values, patriotic dedication. Students are encouraged to take up Research Projects to identify a research problem and apply problem solving techniques learnt in the classroom to the problem.

Jorhat College has made use of ICT facilities in a large-scale manner and encouraged its faculties and students to use ICT enabled tools for effective teaching and learning. All the teachers have contributed towards the PPT Pool coordinated by IQAC. All faculty

members and students have access to Google classroom through which all classes are arranged. Other online platforms like Google meet are regularly used to host events and webinars. The College body as a whole has been working online during the entire duration of the pandemic. Rigorous training of a host of faculties regarding different online tools of teaching and learning conducted by Electronics and ICT Academy, IIT, Guwahati in different colleges from 2019 onwards helped a lot in this regard. Many National and International webinars were conducted within the pandemic period under the banner of different departments and cells and it surely helped the students and the teachers. The continuous internal assessments are crafted with the utmost care

by the teachers. It involves the students and parents about its way of functioning from the time of its admission itself ensuring transparency and confidentiality in the system. The details of the mechanism are provided through the prospectus as well as the academic calendar of the college. The parent -teacher meet held before the beginning of each semester. An examination committee is formed with two or three teachers as in-charges which is headed by the academic vice principal. HoDs of each and every department are responsible for the smooth conduct of the examinations, allotment of duties and setting of question papers. The evaluation works starts immediately, results notified in the notice board and also shared with the students in the class. Records regarding marks are kept in the departments and thus the IA marks are calculated. The two sessional examinations carry 10 marks. Apart from the sessional examinations, five marks is allotted for attendance and punctuality and five mark is also allotted for seminar presentation and group discussion. The entire internal assessment process is well monitored under the guidance of academic vice principal.

2.5.2 - Mechanism to deal with internal examination related grievances is transparent, time- bound and efficient

The college provides a special transparent, time bound and efficient Grievance Redressal Cell under the guidance of Principal, Academic Vice Principal, Academic Coordinator and the Academic Council of HoDs. Sessional marks are given on the departmental notice board which the students can access and discuss with the respective teachers if there are any issues. After that too, time is given to the students to report grievances. At first the departments handle Sessional examination related grievances independently. Jorhat College has formed an administrative and an academic council for decentralization. Instead of concentrating power in his own hands, the Principal has formed the Administrative council with himself, the Vice principal, the Academic Vice-Principal, and the academic Co-coordinator. Besides, An Academic Council is formed with the above administrators and the Head of the Departments as members. All the decisions relating to administration and academic matters are referred to this council.

The college has devised ways of engaging most junior faculty members which reflect participative management. In matter of importance, for example the girls' hostel. Till few years back the hostel super was a 'man' not a woman. But, then, on principle it was decided that there should be a gender shift. Accordingly women faculty members began to be appointed .Now, three woman colleagues, one of them being superintendent and the other two assistant wardens run the hostel efficiently.

Another important initiative towards making the college administration is to take the office staff and the most junior teaching staff into confidence. With such purpose the college has included them in every committee related to IQAC and the Kohinoor Jubilee celebrations, thereby broadening the scope of decentralization and participative management.

Solid Waste Management: The solid waste that is generated in the campus is segregated into biodegradable and non bio degradable wastes. Since the college follows the policy of Reduce, Reuse and Recycle, thus separate dustbins are provided in the campus for dry wastage and wet wastage. The bio degradable waste is dumped into pit, which will be used later as manure for plants in the campus, whereas the non degradable waste is placed into corporation bins for further

processing by the corporation. Two sanitary napkin incinerator machines have been installed in the campus in the girls' common room and girls' hostel respectively to dispose of such napkins. Another puccapit for vermicompost has been constructed recently.

Liquid Waste Management:

Liquid wastes from the point of generation like the canteen, toilets and hostel etc are let out as effluent into proper drainage facility and to avoid stagnation. The liquid wastes are drained in sock pits where fishes are allowed to grow. E-waste management: The major e-waste generated in the institute comprises of batteries, UPS, discarded input devices like mouse, keyboards, wires and cables.

The college aims at strengthening its postgraduate section in three ways: viz, a) further expanding and improving its MA (Distance) of Dibrugarh University(DU) both quantity and quality wise, b) consolidating the newly introduced Krishna Kanta Handique State Open University MA course, c) Introducing regular MA of Dibrugarh University in several departments.
- Regarding Self Financing Courses (SFC), the college looks forward towards introduction of as many as 27 SFC Courses already approved by the DU. It has been decided to introduce these courses as indispensable part of the students' education, thereby enabling them to a) empower themselves, b) be financially self-sufficient. The college has planned to set up a series of Shops/Stalls like those of DTP operators, beauticians, mobile mechanics etc to provide employment to students/alumni, as well as to generate income.
- Planned to upgrade ERP system.
- Planned to participate in NIRF 2023.
- To complete Academic and Administrative Audit on time.
- As the college is entering its Kohinoor Jayanti (Diamond Jubilee) year, it also plans to come up with at least 60 books by the college community, most of which would be academic reference books.
