Concept-Note:

The proposed two-day seminar titled "Dynamics of English literature and Language in the socio cultural and political sphere of Assam" would provide a forum for scholars, linguists, social scientists, media personalities, bureaucrats and politicians from the region to engage in scholarly deliberations on the role of English language and literature in the (un)making of Assamese literature, culture and society. Although not obviously felt, it is a reality that the roots of English language and literature run deep into the Assamese mind and society. English as a language enjoys tremendous prestige in Assam — both within the academia and outside.

The journey of English in Assam has been special; the arrival of the British colonizers and European Christian Missionaries marked the introduction of English language.

As the language of the new rulers, some of the Assamese people did try to learn English with all sincerity which can be understood from the quick proliferation of English language. That there was obvious politics behind the introduction of English in Assam (as in the rest of India) becomes evident through post-colonial studies. Despite the odds, it is to be accepted that activities of the European/ British missionaries, administrators and Tea-Planters did lead to the promotion of the English language and literature in Assam. The interactions between local and the foreign had a far reaching consequence for Assam that covered various dimensions including the linguistic, social, political, cultural, economic, religious and so on. In other words, there is hardly any area left which has remained unaffected by English.

The elitism associated with English is a reality, one with a very good command over the English language is at once given a privileged status in the Assamese society. This peculiar mindset needs to be studied carefully with academic rigour. Further, historical facts like the fragmentation in the greater Assamese Society during 19th Century (under the impact of English), the advent of Bengali language patronized by the British as a part of colonial diplomacy and the language movement which had a great significance in the socio political and cultural aspects of Assam history need also to be studied in perspective vis-àvis the position of English in Assam. It is expected that during the course of the seminar, there would be interesting academic insights into the dynamics of English literature and Language in the socio cultural, political and linguistic spheres of Assam.

- English in Assam: A historical perspective.
